



"Sock your money away so we can Monkey around"



Here is a little something for you to add to your "Sock Monkey" tour. If you have time to make a "Monkey" here are some idea's you could use on the bus.

1. Buy some clothes for "_____ " and see who can dress him the fastest.
2. When the people get on the bus, give them a banana because you are going to be "monkeying" around.
3. Give them 2 blank slips of paper: *one for them to write there names on * one to vote for the name of the "monkey". Or if you would rather name the monkey yourself (maybe after your tour name) introduce him/her...and thank them for coming on "_____ " great adventure to Wisconsin. You can then do a series of "Monkeying" adventures. (ex: "_____ "great adventure to Broadway"
4. Once the "monkey" has a name. Tell everyone that he will be part of your tour. But he gets very lonesome and naughty if he is left alone, so he must have a chaperone. Explain to them that a name will be drawn from the "monkey" bag. (Brown paper lunch bag) every time they get back on the bus. That person will be the chaperone till they get back on the bus again. (Potty Breaks don't count). This monkey must be taken with the chaperone where ever they go.....yup....now if its night time....he goes to your room with you...and you have to make sure he gets to breakfast on time.

Be sure and take a picture of everyone that is a chaperone with your "monkey" as a reminder of the fun you have had. At the end of the tour draw a name again....and that person wins your "monkey" as a fun reminder of your trip.

5. A fun game to play is "Barrel full of Monkeys" This game can be passed around and each person has to connect using the tail to another monkey from the barrel. Or use the game as a prize for any game you play.
6. Write a story about your "Monkey" Every third/fourth person starts his story like a new chapter beginning. Count them off so they know who has the chapter. When they get done writing collect them all and read the story. It really gets to be funny because no one knows what the other is writing.
